**5. Evidence of Student Learning Outcomes**

See narrative

- a. The paper assignments in my Intro to American Government course are an opportunity for students to achieve two of the course learning objectives (demonstrating how political science theories explain collective action problems and how elections shape political behavior). While I give students wide latitude in choosing the direction of their papers, they must pick a topic that engages these learning objectives. I examine the other two learning objectives using six quizzes.
- b. I use the same approach Race and Ethnic Politics where students are asked to write papers on all three learning objectives over the course of the semester: 1) research methods and race; 2) the intertwinement of race and politics in American political campaigns; 3) public policies that disproportionately impact African-Americans
- c. According to SPOT evaluations students tend to enjoy the paper assignments the most in my classes. I attribute this popularity to the short, low-risk design of the prompt and the flexibility they have to explore their interests.

    - *California Journal of Politics and Policy* is the leading journal on California politics. It is administered by CSU Sacramento and UC Berkeley. The journal provides timely insights and historical perspectives on political events, policy outcomes, and voter behavior in the Golden State. This paper went through one round of anonymous peer review and one editorial desk revision. *CJPP* is a peer reviewed journal focusing on California state and local politics, it prioritizes public policy formation and implementation. It is read by both scholars and capitol policy experts. I chose this journal because California is the national leader in proposition campaigns, both in frequency and expenditures. As a result, California voters are among the most practiced (worldwide) in proposition campaigns. Therefore, the conversation about how recent ballot proposition campaigns were received by Californians considering the State’s campaign ad regulations is a perfect fit for this journal. For each peer-reviewed publication, I provide proof of peer-review in the form of “a printout of the journal’s editorial policy” (College RTP policy, line 391) and “copies of readers report” (College RTP policy, line 392). For this publication, the Interfolio folder titled “RSCA – Peer Reviewed” includes the published manuscript (“R1. Ads and Editorials”) and proof of peer review (“R3a. CJPP Editorial Policy”) and reader reports (“R3b. CJPP Reader Reports”).

    - *American Politics Research* is known for high-quality research in the areas of public opinion and political behavior in America. The journal has an impact factor of 1.4 and an h-index of 49. This paper received one round of anonymous peer review. I chose this venue because APR presents the latest developments in voting behavior and media campaigns. It is recognized as a top tier journal centered on Federal and State level government. I submitted to this journal because of the important original result and because this study represented a methodological advancement for the field. In other words, I was able to demonstrate how to select real world political stimuli for a study while not having research subjects pre-conditioned to support or oppose the issue. Previous scholars were limited to using fake political candidates and actors in advertisements, meaning that my contribution marked both a substantive and methodological advancement in the field. ### Manuscripts in Progress

1. “Attitudes Toward Political Advertising Disclosures”
  - This work examines the validity of a new survey instrument measuring disclosure attitudes. It makes the case for a standardized method for identifying policy opinions and latent opinion toward the implementation of disclosure regulations. This work uses the new instrument to examine response to a new campaign finance disclosure reform in California.
2. “Attitudes Toward Prison Conditions”
  - A collaboration with an undergraduate student, this project investigates two public opinion dimensions (1) the state of prison conditions and (2) the state of prisoner labor conditions. It uses an experiment on a sample of Californians to see if either dimension is related to racism or their perception of what causes criminality. We find that Californians minimally desire harsh prison conditions for the “bad apples” in society, yet

they clearly desire better prison and labor conditions when they believe that society has failed those who are incarcerated.

## **D. University and Community Service Activities**

### **Department Service**

#### Political Science Committee Work

1. Curriculum Committee 8/2023- present. I chose this committee so that I could get experience with our course procedures and catalog. As a member, I reviewed proposals for new special topics course offerings and regular course additions to the department catalog. We also decide on course formats by evaluating faculty applications for hybrid and online courses.
2. Co-Chair, Scholarship, Honors, and Awards Committee. 08/2022 – 07/2023. [Member 2020 – 2022]. I chose this committee because I wanted to help recognize our brightest, standout students. I love teaching students, but truly relish the contact we have with exceptional students. As a member, I reviewed applications for scholarships, awards, and the department honors program. As co-chair, I generated procedures to mitigate a tight turnaround deadline where we collated, reviewed, decided, and notified award winners. This was spurred by a desire for equity because we wanted student winners to have enough time to plan to attend the awards ceremony with their parents. In previous years, students were notified at such a late date that they (and family members) could not get time off from work to attend. It was our desire to change that trend in alignment with the CSULB “No barriers” campaign promoting access and equity, even for award winners. Also as co-chair, I presented the awards with a prepared speech.
3. Graduate Committee. 08/2020 – 07/2023. I chose this assignment because of my interest in working with advanced students. This committee dealt with a number of important policy decisions during my tenure. They include adjusting the application deadlines and changing the comprehensive examination procedures for the graduate program. We also developed a comprehensive exam grading rubric. As member, I reviewed applications for the political science graduate program for six cycles. This included reading all application materials and drafting a written evaluation of candidate files. I was a participant in all the decisions to admit candidates.
4. Graduate Program Reform Committee 08/2020 – 07/2023. For the period under review, this committee has undertaken an initiative impacting the graduate program by making a recommendation on how to provide more subfield coverage for political theory.

1. Faculty Council Representative 8/2021 – 7/2023. I volunteered and was elected by my department peers as a department representative on Faculty Council. As a member, I attended monthly meetings where college business is addressed. I was an active participant in decision making on information distribution, a myriad of elections to service positions, and as liaison to my department on decisions like these, decisions impacting the future of CLA.

## CLA Leadership

1. Interim Legal Studies Program Director 1/2024 – present. The director advises students on program requirements to receive a certificate. Because the multidisciplinary program has upwards of 20 course options for students, the director provides critically important guidance that influences student course choices. I volunteered to serve as director because I believe in our students and the market worthiness of a legal studies certificate. The employment landscape is competitive, especially for careers with benefits and livable wages. I believe our certification helps bolster employment portfolios, opportunities, and law/graduate school applications. Our department needed an immediate (interim) director, it was an easy decision for me to step up to fill this temporary void. I have no prior experience doing student advising, I hope this role leads to more opportunities in the coming evaluation period.

I reviewed and discussed (dis)advantages to proposed alternatives with the university’s branding image, the potential to inspire students/staff, and overall attractiveness in mind. Wrote memo articulating preferences and strengths of “Where California Dreams” and “LegendaryU” campaign names.
3. Media Engagement 2020 – present.

I have fielded nearly one hundred media requests for CSULB on local, state, and national politics. Newspaper outlets include *Orange County Register*, *LA Times*, *Sacramento Bee*, *Long Beach Post*, and Black Entertainment Television News—plus dozens of newspapers across California which reprint quotes from affiliated papers. Los Angeles television outlets include ABC 7, CBS2/KCAL, Spectrum1, and NBC 4. San Francisco Bay area outlets include CBS station KPIX 5. I have also made appearances on Australian Public Radio and KNX news radio in southern California. I frequently support our student reporters at the *Daily49er* and *22 West* since they are both practicing their craft and informing our campus body. What you don’t see in my appearances, interviews, and quotes is the trivial and inane drama that surrounds my media engagement. I often turn down stories that do not lead to enlightenment from an expert. I regularly advise journalists when I think their framing of the news is off base. At times tell them I don’t think they have a news story at all. These non-appearances and discussions “on background” frequently shape news narratives, even if I’m not quoted. In broadcast appearances I try to direct attention to the important aspects while

deemphasizing the less important aspects, at times the trivial horse race elements of political coverage. My ultimate goal is to enlighten the public by interpreting political happenings and synthesizing events with political research.
